- 1.)PoeTree & Time Capsule Sandy, Felisa, Robin.
 - Pick up poems after Saturday, March 1.
 - They will meet to read poems March 5 at 2 p.m. at the library and begin selection.
 - Dan has the poetry award trees.
 - Will read the poems / give out prizes during a school assembly on Friday, June 13. (Do not know time yet.)
- 2.) Tree City USA reapplication-Joel
 - Sent it in, results should be coming back soon.
 - Now that the account is set up, should be easier to do the following year.
 - Talked with Steve Deaton for specific information to fill out reapplication.
- 3.) Arbor day plan
 - Saturday, June 14 at 2 or 3 p.m.
 - Include PoeTree reading.
 - If available, will plant extra PoeTree award trees.
 - Could potentially plant a tree in Hope Cemetery to replace one that died 7 years ago.
 - Potentially include time capsule with the Perry Garden Club Hope cemetery planting.
 - May include a walk from the Park St. Garden club dedication past the planting at the corner of Main and Leicester, and then to the Hope Cemetery planting, with perhaps a flag day theme and a tree appreciation quiz for education along the way.

- 5.) Spring Flagging

 - Will also look for outgrown plastic guards to put onto unprotected younger trees.

- 6.) Supplies: fertilizer, trunk protectors, and spring mulch are needed if the budget allows.
- 7.) Next Planting Location Priorities Proposed
 - 43 N. Center St. (F1-3, S1-2 on Pine St.) (request)
 - Tuna and Bradford St. would increase property values
 - Watkins, Cherry (north side), Hawthorne (west side), Hope St.
 - Add more on North Main St. yearly starting at the edge of town
 - More pines on Pine Street
 - Order list comes out in July so letters will go out in the spring.

8.) Requests.

- Evaluation 44 Watrous was off right of way. Thus, not in Tree Board Zone.
- Eleanor requested the removal of the unsightly but healthy maple in front of her house. Wants to pay to remove it and have it replanted. Can she do this?
- We have in Tree Board policy that a homeowner can remove tree in front of their house if approved by Tree Board as long as it is replaced. If they want to choose the replacement tree, the replacement tree also must be approved by the tree board..
- There is nothing in our policy indicating a tree must be sick to be removed.
- Tree Board voted that iit is fine for Eleanor to pay to remove the tree and replace it. Dan will communicate in writing.
- If a citizen pays to have the village to plant a tree, it would cost \$300.

9.) Silver Lake Outlet Trail Upkeep

- Could potentially beautifying trail entrances.
- Multiflora rose (invasive) keeps trees from sprouting. If removed, could plant trees afterwards such as Walnut.
- There is some concern about trees overhanging the trail.

10.) Pruning Days

- Early spring is optimal time. This is when there is less chance of freshly cut trees getting infected with insects and other diseases. It is also the time of year when the structure of the tree is more apparent.
- Wednesday evenings 6:30 p.m. starting March 12. Will occur weekly until we are done pruning.
